## Patent Office Trials and Post Grant Procedures

The law and procedures for trials before the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) have changed significantly in the last year. This year's bootcamp has been updated to include the following cases: *Aqua Products v. Matal* (CAFC) and the subsequent PTAB guidance, and the CAFC decisions and expected Supreme Court decisions in *Oil States Energy v. Greene's Energy* and *SAS Institute v. Matal*. The Post Grant Bootcamp (PGB) includes a comprehensive, hands-on workshop that will start with an overview of post grant procedures before taking an in-depth look at PTAB trials.
